

As we all get on a bit, the locations and our favourite fishing spots we love to visit get quite overfished along with others that also use it and then tell their Mates. New territory is always on the go, but time and fuel prices mean we can't be running around all over the countryside looking for rivers and streams that might be there. That's the old way of doing things, information is 'Key.' It used to be simply grilling your Mates for their secret locations, running just short of torture and blackmail to get the latest information out of them for their best marks and hottest spots.


The availability of GPS units and grid co-ordinates these days have amazing accuracy sometimes within 3-5 Metres taking the guesswork and fail potential out of the equation. Even your mobile phones have the tracking capability to pinpoint your location, a plus is the safety factor in there as well, and should you need rescue.

Scouting new locations can be done from the comfort of your kitchen table. **Google Maps** and **Google Earth** allow you to scan the terrain from overhead satellite imagery, with the added feature of zoom to get an even closer inspection of a possible site. Although you won't be able to spot the fish, you can see their habitat and access roads or vantage points or incoming waterways, ending your walk.

Vision is available within this media in map form or photographic type images, although not in real time, delayed images will not affect you too much, unless you find a shopping centre built there when you turn up in vest and waders.

Scan your local rivers and countryside looking for new access and landings. Look for creek junctions, sandbanks and runs, keep the details and **save** or **pin** into your phone or GPS unit.

Remember this also can be applied to the Bay, mainly shallows at low tide, like Westernport offers. Spotting sandbanks, runoff branches, and reefs, plot these for your next trip out. But remember to delete the dud spots and the successful ones commit to memory and chew, and then swallow. Good Spotting!

Cardinia Shire households can reap the rewards of having a food and garden waste kerbside bin with the Compost Giveaway.

In partnership with the Cardinia Environment Coalition, Cardinia Shire Council is giving two 25L bags of compost to households using a Council food and garden waste (lime green lidded) kerbside bin.

To participate, households will need to register. Registered households can collect their compost from the CEC Nursery Coalition Nursery at Deep Creek Reserve in Pakenham on Fridays 9am-12pm (midday) or the last Saturday of each month 9am- 12pm (midday).

The Compost Giveaway is open now until Saturday 28 June or while stocks last.

Garfield's Dr. Mary Cole Award Finalist

Dr. Mary Cole of Garfield is one three inspiring Victorian women named as finalists for the 2025 AgriFutures Rural Women's Award, recognising their leadership, innovation, and contribution to rural industries and communities.

This award celebrates women driving positive change in rural and regional Australia by empowering them with the skills, support, and leadership opportunities to shape their industries and communities.

Now in its 24th year, the award is a nationally recognised program of influence, providing each state and territory winner with a \$15,000 Westpac grant, professional development opportunities, and access to a powerful alumni network.

Dr Cole is a leading scientist, educator, and founder of Agpath, a biological farming research and education centre helping farmers reduce costs, improve soil health, and build more sustainable businesses. She holds a PhD in plant pathology from Monash University carried out at Monash University, South Australian Dept of Primary Industries & UCLA, Davis, California. Lectures in plant pathology, in particular, grape vine diseases, but agricultural and environmental pathology in general; microbiology of soil and biological/organic and biodynamic principles including the soil food web.

With a remarkable 45 years of experience, Dr Cole has devoted her life to safeguarding the health of our soil, particularly through her advocacy for regenerative agriculture – a conservation and rehabilitation approach to food and farming systems. Her focus includes topsoil regeneration, biodiversity enhancement, water cycle improvement, ecosystem services, bio-sequestration support, and the overall health of farm soil and the need to foster resilience to climate change.

Dr Cole is the current Cardinia Shire's 2024 Senior Citizen of the Year.

The Victorian winner will be announced in March at a ceremony in Melbourne and will then go on to represent Victoria at the National Award in September at Parliament House, where the national winner will receive \$20,000.
