

Fire Danger Period Ending 1st May 2025



As summer comes to a close, the declared Fire Danger Period will officially end on May 1st, 2025. From this date, private open-air burning will be allowed, but it must comply with the local regulations set by Cardinia Shire Council.

Now is a good time to familiarise yourself with the specific requirements, including any restrictions and/or gaining permits needed for burning off in urban areas. It's also essential to remember that you ***must register your burn with the CFA and Triple Zero Victoria. You can do this online at firepermits.vic.gov.au or by calling 1800 668 511.***

While many are eager to clear summer waste, we urge you to exercise extreme caution. The region has seen little rainfall recently, and fires can still spread quickly once ignited. Always ensure that a responsible adult is actively monitoring the burn, and that you have the proper equipment on hand to fully extinguish the fire—cool to the touch—at any time.

TALKIN' ...FISHIN'..... STAY ALIVE AND FLOAT

*Tragically, in recent events and over the past few years there has been a steady increase in drownings attributed to fisherman putting themselves in dangerous situations. These include swimmers, divers, land based fisherman and boaties. There is a minority of these attributed to accidental drownings, but many more could be avoided with the correct use of a life jacket or floatation devices. Don't think along the lines of the uncomfortable and cheap yellow or orange brick styles worn around your neck that were supplied just to comply with current regulations at the time. Serious advancements have been made in design and technology to make today's life jackets both serviceable and comfortable, and of course very effective. Choice is many and varied, the colour is not as important as your visibility especially at night, so choose with this in mind and look for those with high visibility reflective tape. *Check the updated regulations of when and where to wear a life jacket to avoid a fine.*

Make certain you are buying 'Australian Standards Approved' PFD (personal floatation device) and in the correct size for adult or child. Buoyancy vest is an assistance floatation device for water skiing and alike sports, life jackets do what they say, save your life. They are designed to roll you over face up and keep you afloat for long periods until you're rescued. Full life jackets are available in long or removable sleeves with an internal inflation gas cylinder, either manual or automatic water contact activation. Commonly used are the horseshoe shaped overhead and waist strapped, with an internal bladder, these are very comfortable and lay flat against you, you almost forget you're wearing them. Try on a few models first, some fit better than others depending on your body shape, look out for any fabric cutting in or rubbing irritating to the back of your neck, and how easy it is to put on without twisting straps or knotting up around you. Ask for store assistance if you need help. Nearly all have a small compressed gas Co2 cartridge that can be replaced when due, with a rip cord that's pulled to inflate an inner bladder. The exception is those that self-inflate on contact with water should you go in unconscious or have a disability, this is a definite advantage. I would recommend that young children wear the foam filled full vest and remember to attach the strap underneath so they don't slip out the bottom, slippery little suckers they are! And prevents them from pulling a rip cord, "Hey Dad, what's this thing for?" PSSST !

Ensure you do the regular checks on all the straps, seams and plastic buckles and replace any if necessary. Ensure the gas cylinder is free of any rust or corrosion, yours or another's life might depend on this \$30 item, well worth it. Life vests range from about \$75-\$90 and full survival jackets around \$600. If you're a poor swimmer, fish in dangerous locations or open waters including fast flowing streams, there is a particular time to wear one. Use your common sense, there is a particular type of life vest for the type of fishing you do. Don't have it stored away where you can't get to it in a hurry, or wear it anyway, and stay safe.





I don't remember the actual impact, but I do remember the yell of my child at the back shouting "Help". The minute between opening my door and opening the back passenger door felt like a lifetime. The car was filled with dust, which I later learned was from the air bags. I was so grateful when I opened the door and found all six kids were ok.

My husband and I were taken to hospital with minor injuries and the other driver was as shaken as we were. I'd sent her into a third vehicle but gratefully she and the other driver were ok.

The car did its job and protected all of us but was written off. It could have been a lot worse. funnily enough, four years prior I'd helped a family I knew with their claim against an uninsured driver who didn't stop at the sign. Thankfully our insurance covered everything.

The petition that Wayne Farnham is now sponsoring needs your signatures to help improve that intersection. I'm so grateful with our case as it could have been a lot worse. On the upside, in case you're wondering what happened to the beautiful bouquets that had been ordered, well my friends picked me up from Warragal Hospital, and also picked up the flowers. I made the Christmas concert, and the teachers got their flowers.



BRAG UPDATE May 2025

BRAG

"LET'S GIVE BUNYIP SOMETHING TO BRAG ABOUT!"

OUR VISION: *Bunyip and District will become an environmentally sustainable, carbon neutral community*

OUR MISSION: *To reduce Bunyip and District's carbon footprint.*

EVENTS: BRAG members have been attending a couple of very interesting events hosted by the Baw Baw Sustainability Network and Gippsland Climate Change Network during last week.... Always wanting to learn more ways to mitigate climate change and make the world a better place for future generations.

April 28th Community Nuclear Forum in Morwell: An excellent, well attended forum during which we learnt that:

- The proposed site in the La Trobe Valley will not be stable enough for construction to commence until 2055 (that makes a mockery of Dutton's 15-20 year timeline)
- Within 10 years our national grid can be run on 100% renewable energy, with 5 hour battery capacity and about 2% backup from gas. This will be true even on cloudy, calm days.
- Planned private investment in renewables in Gippsland is already over \$40billion including AGL transitioning Loy Yang into a renewable energy hub featuring grid scale batteries
- Unfortunately 2500 renewable energy transition jobs in the Illawarra region have been paused due to uncertainties following the nuclear proposal.
- The LaTrobe Valley community will be severely impacted by a nuclear project with housing prices dropping, new businesses reluctant to start, tourism dropping off and insurance companies unwilling to insure houses, businesses or health in the area....Nuclear is perceived as high risk and the LaTrobe Valley have not been given the opportunity to say no.
- The Electrical Trades Union regards the transition to renewables and electrification as a new industrial revolution which is already supplying quality jobs and will continue to do so for decades...they do not consider nuclear to be a viable alternative in Australia... it produces 40% less power and we have an abundance of sun!
- ...and most scary of all ... new information from Germany indicates elevated levels of childhood leukemia related to nuclear power plants that are functioning well.

May 1st Quitting Gas in Gippsland in Yarragon: Once again a very informative evening we learnt:

- Gippsland is leading the world in the move to renewables we have 12 off shore wind projects in the pipeline due to ideal conditions...shallow water and strong winds just 10kms off shore
- Check out Gippsland New Energy web site for information about many solar and wind projects.
- SEC is investing in big battery sites in Victoria
- Clean Energy Finance Corporation will enable a cheaper home loan on new homes if owner is able to amend their plans to improve their energy rating by at least 1 star.
- Energy Distributors need and are actively facilitating Community Batteries, Micro grids, Minigrids and Battery Energy Storage System to assist with stabilising the grid.

We were also provided with several links and contacts which we will follow up and share with community to help BRAG achieve our vision

Scammer says Sorry

Scrolling through my Facebook account recently my eye caught sight of a notice inserted by a multi millionaire woman who had won 552million dollars in a lottery and was generously giving a large portion of it away. All one had to do was apply and Bingo the money would be on its way!

It was glaringly obvious that this was a very basic amateurish scam that should not fool anyone. So I decided to play along with her game. A golden rule is to never reveal any information about oneself or one's account. She asked me for my address and phone number which I just made up to keep the game going. After some time she told me my parcel containing \$665,000 would be delivered to me that afternoon. I replied with joy and gratitude. However for me to receive this parcel of money I had to pay Courier delivery expenses of \$300.

I had to take a photo of these digits and send to her. I said that I didn't have a camera, nor a mobile phone. I also asked her why there was so much hassle if she was sending me \$665,000 and we were arguing over a miserly \$300. That was it, she had no answer to this question.

After giving her the phantom " numbers " incorrectly several times, she became frustrated and there was anger in her voice. 
