





#### Obituary: Richard (Dick) Petzke

Dick passed away in hospital on Saturday 15 March 2025 after a few years of ill health. His funeral was held at St James Anglican Church in Pakenham and was attended by his mother Lorna, sister Elizabeth, brothers Mike and Sam, daughters Molly and Amelia and all their families.

This is an extract of Mike's eulogy for Dick.

'Dick was born at Frankston Hospital on 17 November 1963, the youngest son of Lorna and Wren Petzke. The family lived in William Street, Frankston. He would spend his time with his brothers and neighbourhood kids riding billy cars in the street, playing footy or flying kites at Victoria Park Oval. They were not averse to getting into a bit of trouble at times and with two older brothers around, Dick would always follow.

In 1971, the family moved to a farm in Pakenham and he went to Pakenham Consolidated from grade 3, where he met his life-long friends Mary Walden and Robert Hogban.

There was always work to do on the farm and Dick got to look after the vege garden and the chooks, this gave him a love of birds and growing things. When he was a bit older, Dick was involved with the Cubs and Scouts and thoroughly enjoyed camping and being in the bush.

When Dick was 12, he asked for money for his birthday and he purchased Billy the cockatoo. Dick and Billy had a unique bond so much so that Bill would sit on Dick's shoulder and they would talk to each other.



When he was 13, Dick went to Warragul Tech. During that time, he had his ankles fused and had to wear callipers for a year. At Christmas, he was bouncing on a trampoline with brother Mike and Mike broke his leg - again. He had to wear the callipers for another 3 months.

At tech, Dick discovered that the trades were not for him but became passionate about art activities so when he left tech, he went to Ballarat Uni to study art, which lasted for 18 months. He tried working at an art studio but decided that office work was not what he wanted to do. So he started his own leadlight business. One of his artworks is a stained glass wine label that is still being used by Dromana Estate.

Dick tried many different jobs over the years and even tried joining the police force, but they said that someone who had 30 jobs in 10 years was not quite the sort of person they were looking for.

Dick met his wife Bernie at Moomba in about 1989 and they married in 1992. They became parents to Molly in 1993 and Amelia in 1995. Dick was a loving and devoted father to the girls. The family lived for a time in Mount Eliza before moving to Karingal. Then Dick had a couple of falls, which lead to discovering he had a brain tumour. The tumour was removed in March 1996, then he and Bernie separated in November 1997.

Dick lived with his Mum and Dad on the farm at Pakenham South before moving with them to Tynong. Billy the cockatoo moved with them too but he went to live with Elizabeth as the noise from the trains made him screech.

For a time Dick could not drive, but after 8 years of assisted training he got his license back and began to be independent again. He volunteered at Outlook in Pakenham, working in the gardens after which he got a job driving a tractor for Oasis Wholesale Nursery. He worked there for 6 years before he became unable to keep working.

In 2010, at the fish and chip shop in Pakenham, Dick met Kay and for the next 10 years they had a wonderful relationship. Kay worked during the week so she and Dick would spend weekends together often going places. They even went on a trip to Tasmania for a fortnight. Sadly, Kay passed away in 2020 after having a heart attack.

The last few years have been hard ones for Dick. After having a few falls in 2021 he went into supported independent living in Warragul for a year, before moving to Devon Meadows and finally to Cranbourne South.

Throughout his battle, Dick didn't lose his sense of humour or mischief. Many a time we felt we were playing charades with Dick, trying to get words out and us making all the wrong guesses. We would often end up all in laughter at each other with Dick having the biggest grin of all.'

Our condolences go to Lorna and all of Dick's family, he is remembered fondly by many Tynong locals as being a friendly, cheeky person who loved visiting and having a chat.

Garfield Community Garden by Dotty, Grateful GCG member

A few days ago, I made a simple soup with potatoes, zucchini and tomatoes from my pretty basic veggie patch; plus a can of peas from the Food Bank shelf at the ADRA opp shop and a big handful of herbs and greens I picked at the Garfield Community Garden. It made me realise how lucky I am to have these resources right here in town and I thought I should let more people know about the Community Garden. Funnily enough, after I'd finished the tasty soup, a new friend I made at the Community Garden messaged me to say she'd pruned back the Chamomile bush that had gone all straggly and wondered if Iknew how to do something useful with the prunings. I am no expert and I've never done it before, but I reckon you can dry the leaves and flowers to make tea...so I Googled it, of course! Love learning something new, that isn't hard to do!

That's one of the things that is what makes GCG so nice to be a part of - you don't have to be an expert or even know anything about gardening to get a lot out of being involved. There's no pressure to take on a particular role, or even show up regularly. We get together on Saturday mornings, between 10am and 12 (or whatever time people can manage) and it's all very relaxed and social. There are some who aren't into chatting much and some who are; some who roll their sleeves up at 9.55 and get stuck right in to weeding, watering, mulching, pruning or whatever task; and others who operate more slowly, having a wander to see what job might take their fancy before doing a bit of something-or-other to help (or not today, thanks). Adults, kids, pensioners, dogs...it's a good mix...oh, and it's called Garfield Community Garden because it's in Garfield; but you don't have to be from Garfield to be 'in' the garden - not long ago, a group of Tamils (from Pakenham) asked if they could grow food at the garden - well, of course, how cool to get a different cultural input - let's see what Pakenham style tomatoes taste like! Apart from the obvious gardening activities, there's the all-important (to me) tea break and catch-up with the usual crowd or meeting someone new - I was made very welcome the first time I showed up and then very welcome again, several weeks later on my second visit, when I couldn't remember anyone's names!

The GCG has been going since 2017, a labour of love and dedication to literally 'growing community' and it's changed and developed so much over the years, with members coming and going, different projects and priorities, setbacks and successes. A lot has happened even in the year since I joined and making that soup the other night got me mulling over the question of 'what makes this community garden special? Why are people attracted to coming together in (and for) this place?' So I asked everyone and this is what I heard:

'It's about community, meeting people'

'I want to help create a pleasant environment for all to visit'

'Growing and sharing food and plants makes sense to me. I don't want to rely on supermarkets and plastic-packaged fruit and veg'

'Sustainable practices, composting, mulching'

'As a parent, it's great that my children get to learn about how food is grown. They love coming here and picking a handful of peas, or tomatoes or whatever and eating them on the spot. I don't have time for a veg patch at home...' 'We have kids come here from the local primary school - I'm a teacher and I love volunteering to teach them skills and get them interested in nature and gardening'

'There's always something to learn'

'Organic, no pesticides is important'

'Having a green space with so many different plants supports wildlife and contributes to biodiversity on our doorstep' 'Do something practical to mitigate climate change'

'I learnt how to propagate tomatoes and got a decent crop from seeds I saved from the GCG last year'

'It feels good to get out of my own head, do something for the benefit of all, not just for myself and my own family - it's a mental health thing'

'Slow down, smell the roses...and rosemary and lemon balm and strawberries...!'

'Help create somewhere special, cosy, beautiful. I know I'm not the only one who comes here for a walk and a think and a little cry sometimes'

'Get together with people who share similar interests. Although we do have differing opinions and ways - that's how it is with groups like this, but everyone's kind and respectful and here for really good purposes; so we work things out' So, there you have it, or at least a snapshot of Garfield's blooming Garden. Come along some time, be part of this lovely thing (it's free by the way).

## Cannibal Creek Catchment Landcare Group Community Planting Day

Cannibal Creek Catchment Landcare Group is holding its fourth Community Planting Day on Sunday 4th May. This year we are planting at the South end of the Lovers Lane site. Access is from Lone Pine Road with parking along Walker Rd. Together we hope to put in 4,300 plants on the day. Visitors are welcome to come along, help with the planting, enjoy a morning tea, and barbeque lunch. The site has now had over 14,600 plants placed in the ground.

This year several corporate groups are coming to help plant out the embankment. Pakenham Secondary College Duke of Edinburgh students are planning on regularly joining us to do some plantings.

The bird life is increasing, and a Thornbill constructed its nest in the 2023 May planting. which was satisfying to see in a shrub that was not even 2 years old. There have now been 48 different bird species seen there and we expect this to increase as the plantings mature and expand.

This year our group will be holding 2 plantings on private properties in Tynong North, one planting at Garfield Reserve, 4 Corporate plantings and 2 school plantings are already scheduled.

Our group is supported by grants from Landcare Victoria, Melbourne Water and Cardinia Shire. Biodiversity grants from Cardinia Shire for property owners were organised by Western Port Catchment Landcare Network Landcare Facilitator Sue Finley.






